6	Your eligibility to take the examination will be communicated to the testing service after all required documents outlined above is received by the MO Board of Nursing. After the board has made you eligible to test, you will receive an Authorization to Test from the testing service by email. The candidate bulletin contains information on how you schedule your exam, acceptable forms of identification required to take the exam and candidate rules.					
	Graduates of nursing programs may practice as a graduate nurse until they have received the results of the first licensure exam taken by the nurse or until ninety (90) days after graduation, whichever first occurs. You can only work as a GN after you graduate and until 1) you receive results of your first exam OR 2) 90 days after your graduation date; whichever of these situations occurs first. You are a graduate after you have completed ALL degree requirements and have officially graduated from your nursing program. If you have any questions, please contact the Board office at nursing@pr.mo.gov. If you practice beyond the graduate exempted practice period, you may be denied the opportunity to test. You are responsible for knowing the date you must cease practicing as a graduate nurse. You are required to abide by the laws in the state in which you practice nursing.
