

Weekend and Evening Option

For busy individuals who are wanting to achieve their BSN, Goldfarb offers the opportunity to advance their career with our Weekend and Evening Option (WEO) which is an an entry-level nursing program for individuals who have completed their first two years of education at an accredited institution of higher learning.

The Weekend Evening Option is a part time, 9-term program that is comprised of 66 credit hours of nursing coursework over 36 months. Applicants must complete 54 credit hours of prerequisite coursework at an accredited institution of higher learning. Barnes-Jewish College Goldfarb School of Nursing admits students for summer, fall and spring terms.

Classes are held during the full calendar year (three terms in a year), students will have lectures twice a week on Tuesdays & Wednesdays from 6:00 pm - 9 or 10 pm. Lab hours and clinical hours will be completed on Saturdays. Lectures & Labs will be held ON CAMPUS (Duncan location) and clinicals will be assigned in the hospitals the same as UDBSN day and ACCBSN. Students will want to add approximately 1 to 2 hours per enrolled credit hour for studying, reading, homework, etc. per week to their plan for scheduling.

Students also have the opportunity to complete their clinical experiences at Barnes-Jewish Hospital and St. Louis Children's Hospital, as well as at other BJC HealthCare facilities and a variety of other community locations, up to a 70-mile radius, throughout St. Louis City, St. Louis County, St. Charles County and surrounding counties.

The Weekend Evening Option prepares students to provide direct care to patients and their families in a variety of health care settings, as well as to pursue higher degrees in nursing. Passing the National Council Licensure Exam (NCLEX-RN®) exam is required to become an entry-level registered nurse.

Barnes-Jewish College Goldfarb School of Nursing is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC), the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) and is approved by the Missouri State Board of Nursing. BarnesJewishCollege.edu/UpperDivision

- TOEFL or IELTS score for all applicants whose native language is not English.
