PROGRAM OVFRVIFW

The <u>BJC HealthCare (BJC) Full-Ride Scholars (FRS) program</u> a limited number of newly admitted students in the Barnes Jewish College <u>Goldfarb School of Nursing</u> (Goldfarb) <u>Bachelor of Science in Nursing</u> (BSN) Upper Division and Accelerated programs each academic term. Recipients, BJC Full-Ride Scholars (Scholars), apply their education in a full-time eligible RN position at a BJC entity to fulfill a continuous 3-year work commitment, after graduating from Goldfarb and passing the NCLEX.

Purpose

The BJC FRS program originated in the summer of 2022 to support a diverse and inclusive pathway into nursing by improving access to nursing education and stabilizing the nursing workforce in the areas of highest need. The aim is to increase the number of BSN enrollments at Goldfarb and to increase the retention of graduate nurses at BJC.

Goldfarb incorporates innovative teaching models and a supportive culture to prepare students in a diverse, academically rigorous environment to provide exceptional care. Goldfarb students learn the science and skills of nursing and apply their knowledge during clinicals and in a state-of-the-art <u>Clinical Simulation Institute</u> lab with virtual reality. BJC consists of 14 hospitals and 4 health service organizations that provide various healthcare services including inpatient, outpatient, virtual, primary, convenient, behavioral, home, rehabilitation, community, long-term, and hospice. BJC has a world-class reputation for top physicians, hospital safety and quality, service line excellence, patient satisfaction, nursing quality, and cancer care as shown in the BJC awards and recognitions and Magnet designation. The BJC FRS program aligns with the BJC mission to improve the health and well-being of the people and communities we serve through leadership, education, innovation, and excellence in medicine. Program Manager Support

A designated program manager provides individualized support by connecting with recipients throughout their journey as students, during the transition to practice, and as nurses. Recipients are provided avenues to collaborate with the Full-Ride Scholars' community and to seek guidance to identify roles that create daily joy, navigate nursing, develop professionally, obtain answers to program questions, and access organizational resources.

Eligibility

- Newly admitted student in the Goldfarb Accelerated or Upper Division BSN program
- Selection criteria is provided in the program application
- Prior to receiving the program award, the recipient must be fully admitted which includes admission criteria met, deposit paid, and final transcripts received by Goldfarb

Application

- New students will be notified when applications are open
- Apply through the Goldfarb admission application portal
- Applicants receive an email of being selected or not selected within 2 weeks after the deadline
- Anticipated application open and deadline dates are listed below and are subject to change:

Spring 2024 Open: 11/10/2023 Deadline: 12/17/2023
 Summer 2024 Open: 3/8/2024 Deadline: 4/14/2024

Participation Expectations

The recipient must:

- Graduate from the Goldfarb BSN program according to the <u>student handbook</u> including graduating within the on-time degree completion:
 - o BSN Accelerated Program within 3 terms, maximum 5 terms
 - o BSN Upper Division Program within 5 terms, maximum 7 terms
- Complete the work commitment:
 - o Pass NCLEX within 90 days of degree conferral (i.e., date degree received), and
 - o Obtain and maintain state licensure, and
 - Complete the application process and commence work in a full-time (35+ hours/week) eligible RN position (as listed in Appendix A) within 90 days of degree conferral, and
 - o Complete 3 years of continuous work in a BJC full-time eligible RN position
- Repay BJC the unforgiven loan amount, plus applicable interest, at a prorated amount for years served within 90 days of not meeting the participation expectations

Notes to recipients:

- \circ A specific department is not guaranteed and is based on openings at that time
- o Participating in this program will not impact your compensation
- o Inform your hiring leader of the date you must start an RN position and when you obtained an RN license

Benefit Amount

- Forgivable loan up to \$60,000, funding 100% of Goldfarb BSN program qualifying tuition & fees
 on a term-by-term basis is paid by BJC directly to Goldfarb on behalf of the recipient
- Costs not funded, include but are not limited to:
 - Tuition at another institution

o Books

Clinical supplies and fees

- Course retake/repeat
- Goldfarb tuition deposits are required to be paid directly to Goldfarb by the recipient, however the recipient will receive a \$150 credit in the first term
- For each year of continuous work in an eligible RN position, BJC shall forgive one-third of the total principal aggregate loan amount (forgiven loan amount)
- The principal aggregate loan amount is taxable income to the recipient

Terms and Conditions
