### **Policy Statement**

This policy applies to any Goldfarb School of Nursing ("Goldfarb") Student who brings their Child or Children to Campus. This policy is intended to ensure a productive and safe environment where Goldfarb Students can meet their educational obligations.

## I. Definitions

- a. <u>Campus</u> all Goldfarb facilities and educational sites
- **b.** <u>*Parent or Guardian*</u> any adult who is responsible for a Child while on Campus regardless of the Student's relationship to the Child
- c. <u>Student</u> any individual enrolled in classes at Goldfarb

## **II. Student Guidelines**

- **a.** Children of Students are not to be brought to school on a regular basis in lieu of childcare.
- **b.** On rare occasions, Students may bring their Children to school for brief periods of time for school-related business. Permission must be obtained in advance from the faculty member if bringing their Child to a meeting with faculty or attending class with a Child.
- **c.** Parents or Guardians are solely responsible for providing continuous, direct supervision of their Children on Campus.
- d. Children must not be left unattended or with Faculty, Staff, or other Students.
- e. Students are not permitted to ask Faculty and Staff to supervise their Children.
- **f.** Children of Students are not permitted to use Goldfarb resources, including but not limited to computers, printing, and supplies, while on Campus.

#### **III. Revocation of Privilege**

Allowing Students to bring their Children to Campus is a privilege with limitations extended by Goldfarb to assist in meeting family needs and responsibilities and may be revoked if the Child's presence becomes disruptive to the academic environment.
